Report on the dendrochronological analysis of the panel „Crucifixion“ (Cranach the Elder, Inv.-No. 100 30, signed 1532)

The analysed panel (76,3 x 55,0 cm) is made of three beech boards. Using the beech master chronology following datings could be obtained:

board I	54	growth rings	1468 - 1415
board II	122	growth rings	1523 - 1402
board III	105	growth rings	1519 - 1415

The youngest heartwood ring was formed out in the year 1523.

The boards II and III are made out of the same tree like the boards of the following paintings:

The youngest growth-ring of this tree is from 1524.

For the manufacturing of beechwood panels normally only the bark was removed and the entire tree was used. Therefore an earliest felling date can be derived with the year 1524. Under the assumption of 2 years for seasoning at least a creation is plausible from 1526 upwards.
